

A SHOW OF ROBOTS, INDUSTRIAL INTERNET OF THINGS (IOT) AND TECHNOLOGIES FOR DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION

The 13th edition of Automation Expo concluded on a positive note, setting new records in terms of exhibitors and visitors.

Automation Expo 2018 (August 29-September 1, 2018), the four-day extravaganza of factory and process automation with Robots, Internet of Things (IoT) and Innovations in Manufacturing Technologies on display, ended on a positive note on the evening of September 1, 2018 at the Bombay Convention & Exhibition Centre, NSE Complex, Mumbai. The event set new records: more than 34,892 unique visitors among the total number of 45,891 footfall and 934 exhibitors, making it the most successful in the series so far since inception in the year 2002.

For the first time since inception, Automation Expo was held in two halls at the sprawling NSE Complex. While Hall 1 had the traditional automation majors in factory and process automation with the solutions in plant and process automation, Hall 2 had robots, the Industry 4.0 zone with 10 participating companies, augmented reality, virtual reality, several 3D printing solutions and a series of interesting start-up companies and also the Innovation Zone with student participation.
